WEEKLY HOMILY / HOMILÍA SEMANAL

Thirty-Third Sunday OT/Trigésimo Segundo Domingo TO, Ciclo C

In today's second reading, St. Paul tells us that he worked "night and day." You and I might be tempted to say, "Well, good for him." The problem is that the Apostle mentions this not just as a personal choice, but as a "model" for us, an example he wants us to follow. Now, I don't think Paul was an early version of the American workaholic.* On the contrary, in the course of his long voyages, he found plenty of time for quiet reflection, study, writing, conversation, stargazing and other activities we would call "leisure." And when he did settle in a city for a few months or a few years, he spent time getting to know the people and the lay of the land. To earn a living, St. Paul made tents. He did not shrink from manual labor and the organizational tasks involved in operating a small business. Besides the work involved in making a good product, the tent-making business required constant attentiveness, planning and follow through. He had to keep track of his tools and inventory, study the market and cultivate clients. He worked night and day, but, even so, his business did not absorb every moment of his time. He had a deeper focus: bringing Jesus' saving love to every person he could. St. Paul's example speaks volumes about Stewardship. It doesn't matter whether you are part of a profession or part of the service industry, whether you are a student or retired - you are called to work night and day. That is, God asks you to recognize that every moment belongs to him. Give every moment to God and you will be amazed: He will give you time for legitimate leisure and the opportunity to make a living by providing a needed service to others. Above all, he will open doors so that you can help someone receive Christ's saving love. May God Bless you always

En la segunda lectura, San Pablo menciona que trabajo "de día y de noche." Podemos pensar que esta bien para el pero no para mi. El problema es que lo dice no como una opción personal, sino como un "ejemplo" que nos quiere seguir. Pues, no creo que Pablo era una versión temprana del famoso "workaholico" americano.* Al contrario, en el transcurso de su viajes largos, encontró bastante tiempo para reflexión tranquila, estudios, escribir, conversación, mirando a las estrellas y otras actividades tranquilas. Y cuando se estableció en una ciudad por unos meses o años, paso tiempo conociendo a la gente y el ambiente. Para ganar la vida, San Pablo hizo carpas. No desprecio el trabajo manual y las tareas de organización envueltas en manejar un pequeño negocio. A parte del trabajo implicado en hacer un buen producto, el negocio hacer carpas requería atención, planificación y cumplimiento. Tenía que guardar sus herramientas, procurar el inventario y cultivar clientes. Trabajo de noche y de día. No obstante, su negocio no absorbió todo su tiempo. Tuvo un enfoque más profundo: llevar el amor salvador de Jesús a toda persona posible. El ejemplo de San Pablo habla volúmenes de Mayordomía. No importa si eres parte de una profesión o de la industria de servicio, si eres estudiante o jubilado - estas llamado a trabajar de día y de noche. Es decir, Dios te pide reconocer que todo momento pertenece a el. Dar todo momento a Dios y te daré tiempo para placeres legítimos - y la oportunidad de ganar la vida proveyendo un servicio necesitado por otros. Sobre todo, abrirá las puertas para que puedas ayudo a otro a experimentar el amor redentor de Cristo. Que Dios me los bendiga a todos ustedes y a sus familiares y amigos.

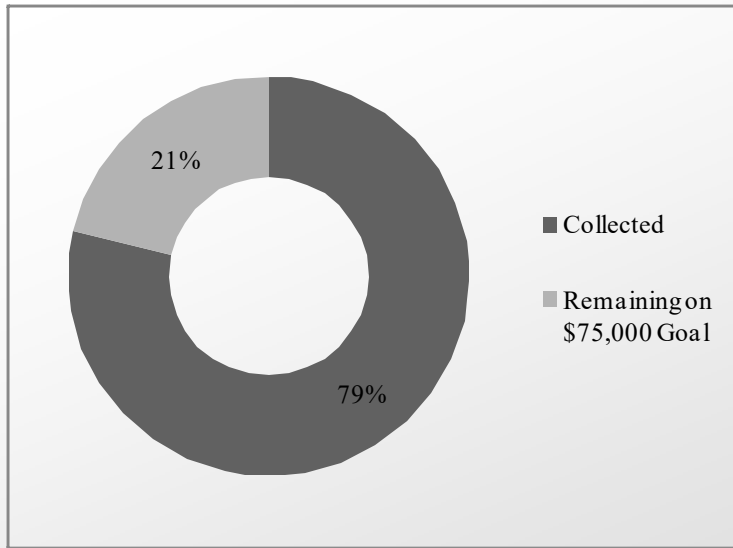
