A NOTE FROM FR. JAVIER ARACIL

My first visit to St. Anthony of Padua was back in the summer of 1966. Fr. A. J. Louis, SDB was the pastor. He needed a substitute for a week and it was on that occasion than I came to St. Anthony's for the first time. Trinity Hospital was St. Elizabeth Hospital at that time, and the Salesian Sisters ran the then St. Anthony parish school. The Salesian Fathers and Brothers had been in the parish for over 40 years. These days I have been looking at old pictures and memory books and through those pictures St. Anthony's lives up to the ideal of a center of spiritual, community and social activities much loved and at the center of the life of Elizabeth/Peterstown, NJ.

I was back in 1996 as an assistant pastor to the energetic Fr. Vince Zuliani, SDB. Fr. John P. Murphy, SDB had been taking care of the Spanish Apostolate, which had become a pastoral need of the community, to which task I was also assigned. My stay was brief, but I was back for a four year period from 2007 to 2011, and I was back in the fall of 2013.

There are many Salesians in the Eastern United States who like myself, can give an account of their service at St. Anthony's. It is my experience that we have all greatly profited from sharing with this community of faith, and its parishioners. Through it our faith in Jesus and has grown in our commitment to service in the name of His Church.

We have felt also the friendliness and affection of so many of you and we have taken with us the memories of those friendships. Those memories live on in us, as we know they live on in you.

The community of St. Anthony of Padua has its life in the many of you who are truly the soul of the parish and gather together for worship, for devotion, and growth in your Christian calling. Jesus is at the center of the community and of each of your hearts. That is what gives life to the church, the living stones that build up the Church of Christ in Elizabeth/Peterstown, NJ.

Together with traditional devotions of representatives of the European and Latin American countries of origin of our parishioners, the image of several saints and of representatives Salesian Saints: Don Bosco, Dominic Savio, and Mary Mazzarello, but most preeminently Our Blessed Mother Mary Help of Christians, will remain at St. Anthony's as a witness to the Salesian presence during so many years.

Mysterious are the ways of the Lord and while we leave this community with a heavy heart we also leave it in the spirit of faith and the spirit of Obedience, which are so fundamental in the running of the Church and more specifically of our Salesian Congregation. I take many happy memories of St. Anthony with me, especially my appreciation for the many moments of prayer and worship and the sharing of the sacramental life of the parish, I have lived with you all, with a special emphasis on the Spanish speaking community with whom I share a common ethnic origin.

One thing I am sure of, wherever my new assignment may be, Jesus will be there waiting for me, as I am sure that he remains here with you and as I say good-bye and hear some say "Vaya con Dios", together with many other farewell wishes, it is Jesus who will keep us in spiritually united, in a union that nothing in the world can break.

Mi primera visita a San Antonio fue durante el verano de 1966. El párroco era en aquel tiempo el P. A.J. Louis, SDB. Necesitaba un sustituto por una semana y fue entonces que vine a San Antonio por primera vez. El Hospital Trinity se llamaba Saint Elizabeth Hospital. Las Hermanas Salesianas, Hijas de María Auxiliadora regentaban la escuela parroquial de San Antonio. Los Padres y Hermanos Salesianos hacía ya más de 40 años que estaban en esta parroquia. Repasando últimamente fotos antiguas y libros de memorias de las celebraciones es innegable que la parroquia de San Antonio ha sido por tantos años el eje espiritual y comunitario muy al centro de la vida social de Elizabeth/Peterstown, NJ.

Regresé en el 1996 como vicario del energético párroco P. Vince Zuliani, SDB. El P. Juan P. Murphy, SDB, llevaba el servicio de la Comunidad Hispano-parlante que se había convertido en una necesidad pastoral de esta comunidad, y ésta fue también mi misión. En el 2007 regresé a San Antonio esta vez hasta el 2011 y dos años más tarde volví en el otoño del 2013.

Son muchos los Salesianos en la región del Noreste de Estados Unidos quienes, como yo, pueden dar una relación de servicio en San Antonio. Mi experiencia es que hemos ganado mucho al compartir con esta comunidad de fe, constituida por los feligreses de la parroquia, nuestra fe en Jesús que nos ha hecho crecer en nuestra dedicación al servicio de su Iglesia.

También hemos gozado de la amistad y afecto de tantos de Ustedes y guardamos el recuerdo de su amistad. Son recuerdos que viven en nuestra memoria y ciertamente en la de muchos de Ustedes.

La comunidad de San Antonio de Padua tiene su vida enraizada en tantos de Ustedes que son verdaderamente el alma de la parroquia cuando se reúnen para las celebraciones litúrgicas y devocionales. Es Jesús quien está al centro de la comunidad y en el centro del corazón de cada uno de Ustedes. Es eso lo que da vida a la iglesia, las piedras vivas de la Iglesia de Cristo en Elizabeth/Peterstown, NJ.

Junto con las imágenes de santos de la devoción de países Europeos y de Latino América, quedan en la iglesia las imágenes representativas de los santos salesianos, San Juan Bosco, Domingo Savio y María Mazzarello pero sobre todo, la imagen de nuestra Madre, María Auxiliadora de los Cristianos que garantizan el recuerdo de la presencia salesiana de tantos años en esta parroquia de San Antonio de Padua.

Misteriosos son los caminos del Señor y si es verdad que nos alejamos de esta comunidad con pena en el corazón, lo hacemos con espíritu de fe y espíritu de Obediencia, que son fundamentales en la Iglesia y específicamente en la Congregación Salesiana. ahora preparo mi traslado a otra comunidad salesiana. Me acompañan los recuerdos entrañables de los momentos vividos en San Antonio, los múltiples momentos de adoración, devoción y compartir de la vida sacramental de la parroquia. De un modo especial los vividos con la comunidad Hispana con la que comparto mi origen étnico y su lengua.

De una cosa estoy seguro; sea donde sea que la Obediencia me envíe, allí estará Jesús esperando mi llegada y tan seguro estoy también que el mismo Jesús permanece aquí en cada uno de Ustedes, y al decir mi adiós y oír el "Vaya con Dios!" de muchos de Ustedes, será Jesús quien nos mantendrá espiritualmente unidos junto con su Madre Santísima, y de esta unión nadie ni nada en el mundo podrá separarnos

- 5. Proof of residence for children under school age. (Utility bill is acceptable.)
