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**WEEKLY HOMILY / HOMILÍA SEMANAL**


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**Thirty-Third Sunday OT/Trigésimo Tercer Domingo T.O. Ciclo/Cycle A**

In today's Gospel, Jesus told the parable of a man whose words changed things for those around him. The master called in his three servants, and with his words he entrusted each of them with a sum of money to care for in his absence. When he returned the master called each man to account. When the first and second servants announced they had each doubled their master's money, the master said to each of them, "Well done, my good and faithful servant. Since you were faithful in small matters, I will give you great responsibilities. Come; share your master's joy." The master's words gave them praise and greater responsibilities and authority. When the third servant arrived with only the money he had initially received, his master commanded, "Take the talent from him...and throw this useless servant into the darkness outside where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth." The master's words brought condemnation and punishment to the third servant. The master's words had power. They could alter the situation of his servants. Yet the power of his words is nothing compared to power of the words found in the celebration of the Mass and in the other liturgies of the Church. In the Mass, we hear God's transforming word proclaimed in the scripture readings. We hear words that have touched the lives of countless millions of people down through the ages. We hear how God spoke through Moses and the prophets, and above all through Jesus, his Son, the Word made Flesh. In the Mass we also hear the words, the voice, of the Church. The words that make up the prayers of the Mass were carefully chosen by the Church, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, to express what we believe. There is a principle that says what the Church prays, is what the Church believes. That means that if a person wants to know the Catholic faith, that person simply has to listen to the prayers of the liturgy. How we pray, reveals what we believe. May God bless you always.

En el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús nos cuenta una parábola sobre un hombre, que llamó a tres de sus siervos y les encargó a cada uno una suma de dinero para que la cuidasen mientras él estaba ausente. Cuando este Señor regreso de su viaje, llamo a sus tres criados para ver como o que habían hecho con su dinero. Cuando el primero y el segundo le dijeron lo que habían hecho y logrado con su dinero, el Señor de estos siervos les dijo:” ¡Bien hecho! Siervos buenos y fieles, como habéis sido fieles en los asuntos pequeñitos, os daré mucho mas grandes responsabilidades. Venid y entrad en el descanso de vuestro Señor.” Las palabras de este Señor, les dio a estos siervos alabanza, una mayor responsabilidad y autoridad. Cuando llego el tercer siervo a rendir cuentas, y solo le llevó el dinero que había recibido inicialmente, su Señor ordeno: “Quítenle el talento... y arrojen a este siervo inútil y perezoso a fuera donde será el llanto y el rechinar de dientes.” Las palabras del Señor trajeron sobre este siervo condenación y castigo. Las palabras de este Señor tenían poder, y podían alterar o cambiar la vida de estos siervos. Ahora, en una situación similar a la de estos siervos, ¿Cómo actuaría yo? ¿Sería inteligente como los dos primeros, y ganaría más de lo que me habían encomendado, o seria perezoso y miedoso y no haría nada? Por que esto es lo que vamos a escuchar un día, cuando se nos llame a rendir cuentas al Señor Todopoderoso, haber, Oscar, ¿que has hecho con los talentos que te deje en depósito hasta que volviera? Y que responderemos, lo haremos con alegría y seguridad, sabiendo que hemos ganado más de lo que se nos había encomendado, o ¿estaremos en una situación, un poco o mucho, embarazosas por miedo a no saber como responder? Este Evangelio nos llama hoy a hacer un examen de conciencia profundo, y ver que hemos hecho con los talentos que Dios nos ha dado, con todos esos bienes que Dios ha puesto en nuestras manos para hacer su nombre santo entre las naciones. Que Dios me los bendiga a todos ustedes y a sus familias.

### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Earlier this autumn, we looked at how our Eucharistic Prayers have been enriched by the approval of several new prayers to augment the old Roman Canon. For us, there are the four standard prayers, three for Masses with Children, and the most recent addition, the former Swiss Eucharistic Prayer with four alternative forms (now known as the Eucharistic Prayer for Masses for Various Needs and Occasions).

We also have two Eucharistic Prayers for Masses of Reconciliation. The source for these two prayers is the request by many bishops for a special prayer for the "Holy Year" of 1975. Originally, the committee in charge was commissioned to write a single prayer, but the theme proved so rich that it gave rise to two. The first is based on and develops biblical texts on reconciliation. The second starts with the experience of living in today's fractured world, and how the Spirit calls us to reconciliation and peace. Not everyone was happy with all this creativity, saying that if too many were published, it would be difficult for the Vatican to control further requests. Everyone thought the pope would put strict limits on the prayers, but in the end he said he was willing to open doors that had long been closed. Although he approved them for a period of only three years, they were never formally removed from the Sacramentary and have been incorporated into the new Roman Missal

### TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

El 23 de noviembre de 1927, un pelotón de soldados conducía al jesuita mexicano Miguel Agustín Pro Juárez al paredón de fusilamiento. Uno de ellos le susurraba "perdóneme". Miguel le respondió que no sólo lo perdonaba, sino que le daba las gracias por darle la oportunidad de dar testimonio de su fe derramando su sangre por Cristo. Días antes había sido arrestado y acusado de intento de asesinato contra el presidente mexicano Álvaro Obregón. En realidad su delito era el de bautizar niños, bendecir matrimonios, llevar la comunión a los enfermos y escuchar la confesión de los arrepentidos.

Miguelito nació en 1891 y entró al noviciado jesuita en 1914, al mismo tiempo que el gobierno mexicano comenzaba una persecución en contra de la Iglesia. Debido a esta situación, Miguel tuvo que hacer su formación religiosa fuera de México. Apenas pudo, regresó a su nación como sacerdote e hizo su pastoral a escondidas, sabiendo muy bien que podía ser martirizado.

Miguel decía a sus amigos que al morir iría al cielo y si se encontraba con santos resacos, bailarían un jarabe tapatío hasta hacerles sonreír para Cristo Rey
