**WEEKLY HOMILY / HOMILÍA SEMANAL**

**Sixth Sunday of Easter /Sesto Domingo de Pascua**


---

Today's Gospel continues the same trend of thought of last week's Gospel, the indivisible communion of Christ with his Father and with his followers, the Christians. But in today's Gospel, Christ puts a condition—without it there is not this communion in the love of the Trinity. This condition is as Jesus said in the Gospel: "If you love me you will fulfill my commandments." So we can summarize Christ's commandments into two, to love God above all, and our neighbor as ourselves. This summary of the Law of Sinai, the Ten Commandments, they are divided in two groups, the first three commandments make a reference to our relationship with God directly, and the second seven commandments toward our relationship with our neighbors. Because I said very often, "We cannot love God without loving our neighbors." Christ explains what the consequence of this kind of love is: "So if my Father loves him, I will love him, and I will manifest myself to him." So, if we want to have a real manifestation of Christ in our lives, it is very easy to get it, we need only one thing, to love him in this way, fulfilling his commandments. It is true it is not easy to do it right? How difficult is it to love our neighbor if the love is not reciprocated, but that is why we have this Gospel today, because it is a gift, The Gift of the Holy Spirit, because this is what we need, the Holy Spirit, the one who can help us to love. Jesus makes a promise, "I will not abandon you, but I will send upon you the Spirit of Truth, the Holy Spirit. Jesus makes clear that this Spirit is not known by the world. Why? Because the world, our society, does not accept the truth. And what is the truth? Love thy neighbor. We have been told since we were very little to love ourselves, meaning to give us all the pleasure that we can, and avoid all kind of sufferings, so we are selfish by nature, and not by chance is this type of nature that Christ wants to change in us. He knows very well that we ourselves cannot do it just by making an effort or trying harder and harder. So let us ask Christ to receive the Holy Spirit, so our nature could be transformed from a selfish nature, just looking out for ourselves only, to a selfless one, looking to love the neighbor. May God bless you always.

En el Evangelio de este Domingo, se sigue el mismo tema de la semana pasada, la comunión indivisible de Cristo con su padre y con los cristianos. Pero Cristo en el Evangelio de hoy pone una condición sin la cual no puede existir esta comunión en el amor. Esta condición, es el amor incondicional. Jesús les dice a sus apóstoles: "Si me aman cumplirán mis mandamientos." Los mandamientos de Jesús se pueden resumir, como él mismo dijo, en dos: "Amar a Dios y al prójimo como a uno mismo." Este resumen de la ley del Sinaí, los diez mandamientos, ya que los tres primeros mandamientos hacen referencia a Dios directamente, y los siete de la segunda tabla a los hombres, a nuestros prójimos. Ya que como he manifestado muy a menudo, no podemos amar solo a Dios y no a nuestros hermanos. Aquí Cristo hace esta aclaración al darnos este resumen de la ley. Y continuación explica cual es la consecuencia de este amor, "Para que mi padre lo ame, yo lo ame y me manifieste a él." Así que si queremos recibir una manifestación de Cristo en nuestra vida, es muy fácil de conseguirla, solo necesitamos amarlo, ¿Cómo? Cumpliendo sus mandamientos. Bueno, eso de fácil no es tanto, ¿Verdad? Que difícil es amar al prójimo cuando el amor no es reciproco, pero para eso el Evangelio incluye un regalo, el don del Espíritu Santo, eso es lo que necesitamos, ese Espíritu que nos ayude a amar. Jesús nos hace una promesa que va a cumplir el día de Pentecostés, "No los dejare huérfanos, no los abandonaré, sino que les enviare el Espíritu de la verdad, El Espíritu Santo." Ahora, aclara Cristo, que a este Espíritu el mundo no lo conoce. ¿Por qué no? Por que el mundo, la sociedad, no aceptan la verdad, ¿Y cual es la verdad? El amor al prójimo. Siempre nos han enseñado a amarnos a nosotros mismos, en el sentido de darnos gusto en todo, por esto, somos egoístas por naturaleza, y es esta naturaleza la que Cristo quiere cambiar en nosotros, por que El sabe muy bien, que nosotros solos con nuestro esfuerzo no podemos. Así que, pidamos al Señor Jesucristo resucitado de entre los muertos, que hoy podamos recibir esta gracia, que nuestra naturaleza sea transformada, que podamos pasar de ser seres egoístas, que solo nos buscamos a nosotros mismos a seres generosos para con los demás. Que Dios me los bendiga a todos ustedes siempre.

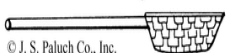

### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

In ancient Rome, the beautiful month of May was dedicated to the goddess Flora, the patroness of flowers and new life. May 1 was considered the beginning of abundant growth, and a day for public festivals aimed at expelling winter. Even after Christianity took hold, the customs of the pagan feast lingered behind. Long ago, there was a thirty-day devotion to Mary, sometimes called "Lady Month," which began on August 15. By the eighteenth century, the custom of assigning devotions to months of the year was developing. June, for example, was the month of the Sacred Heart, and October was for the Holy Rosary. Beginning with the Jesuit Order in Rome and spreading throughout the world, May has been celebrated as the month of Mary, the Blessed Mother, for more than two hundred years. That was a welcome remedy to some enduring pagan practices, such as maypole dancing and the crowning of the May Queen. Some historians say that in ancient times the May Queen was actually a human sacrifice. Devoting May to Mary is undoubtedly a better thing to do.

### TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Durante la Última Cena, Jesús dijo a sus apóstoles: "Yo soy la vid, ustedes son los sarmientos" (Juan 15:5). Jesús añade que los sarmientos (ramas) que permanecen en él, dan mucho fruto. Según la agricultura, la vid es una parra, es decir, una planta perenne de ramas frondosas. Una parte importante de la vid son las hojas. Es obvio que una vid tiene hojas, pero Jesús no las menciona, prefiere enfocarse en los sarmientos. Las partes de la vid son las raíces, tronco, sarmientos, hojas, flores y fruto. Según esta división Jesús sería el tronco, pero él dice ser la vid completa. Esta es una imagen de la unidad que Jesús quiere entre sus seguidores. Recordemos que Jesús celebra la Última Cena con sus discípulos. La comunidad de discípulos unidos a Jesús formamos la vid. Los sarmientos o ramas conducen agua y minerales a las hojas, flores y frutos, y son útiles en tanto estén unidos a la vid. Lo mismo vale de los cristianos, discípulos de Jesús. Son ellos y ellas los que hacen presente y le dan vida a Jesús en el mundo de hoy.
